About Liturgy: *Mastery over liturgy, part 1:*

Because liturgy makes present the paschal mystery and is the celebration of the whole church, no local parish or liturgical community has complete freedom in what they do with liturgy. The "mastery" over liturgy actually unfolds in different ways and at different levels.

First, each liturgy or rite has an *editio typica*, that is, an official text, which is promulgated (usually in Latin) by the Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments in Rome; which, in turn, is translated (in English by I.C.E.L., that is, the International Commission on English in the Liturgy); and approved. Then each conference of bishops (usually a country) makes appropriate pastoral adaptations for a particular country, which must also be approved by Rome. With the *editio typical* and because of the pastoral adaptations of a conference, some legitimate options and variations are part of every rite.

Second, texts and norms must be interpreted. This is not so easy as it might seem. For example, the United States bishops have determined that a profound bow is a sign of respect we make before receiving Communion. Two interpretation questions arise: what does a "profound" bow look like and when is it made? Because of the need for interpretation, variations in how this directive is implemented in the various diocese occur.

Every Life Is A Vocation

In *Veritatis splendor*, sections 7 and 8, Pope John Paul II stated: "In the rich young man, whom Matthew's Gospel does not name, we can recognize every person who, consciously or not, approaches Christ the Redeemer of man and questions him about morality. For the young man, the question is not so much about rules to be followed but about the full meaning of life. This is in fact the aspiration at the heart of every human decision and action, the quiet searching and interior prompting which sets freedom in motion. This question is ultimately and appeal to the absolute God which attracts us and beckons us; it is the echo of a call from God who is the origin and goal of man's life."

In trying to discover the meaning of our life, faith and reason work together to help us discover meaning and our vocation in life. In his encyclical, *Populorum Progression*, Pope Paul VI taught "in the design of God, every man is called upon to develop and fulfill himself, for every life is a vocation."

Looking at our life from the perspective of vocation includes an awareness of our responsibility and stewardship of the time, gifts, talents and resources that God gives us. How do we express our gratitude to God? How do we share our gifts for the good of others? For our life to have meaning we need to discover our vocation and exercise good stewardship of what is given to us. The human search for meaning, assisted by faith and grace, helps us to discover our vocation in life and a co-responsibility for the evangelizing mission of the Church.

In his message to the European Congress on Vocations (April 29, 1997), Pope John Paul II stated: "Life has an essentially vocational structure. In fact, the plan for it stems from the heart of the mystery of God. 'he chose us in him [Christ] before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him' (eph.1:4). All human existence is therefore an answer to God, who makes his love felt especially on some occasions: the call to life; the entrance into his Church's communion of grace; the invitation to bear witness in the Christian community to Christ according to a completely personal and irreplaceable plan; the definitive call to communion with him at the hour of death.

"There is no doubt therefore that the ecclesial community's commitment to the pastoral care of vocations is most serious and urgent. In fact, every baptized person must be helped to discover the call that in God's plan is addressed to him and to make himself available to it. It will thus be easier for those who receive a special vocation to service to the kingdom to recognize its value and generously accept it. In fact, it is not a question of educating people to do something, but of giving a radical direction to one's existence and of making decisive choices that guide one's future for ever."

SAINT MARIA GORETTI (1890-1902) July 6

Does anything match a mother's pride in her children? First Communions, confirmations, graduations, weddings: how these delight a mother's heart! Imagine, then, Assunta Goretti, the only mother ever to attend her child's canonization! In poverty-stricken rural Italy, widowed Assunta tended fields for the Serenelli family, whose eighteen-year old son Alessandro propositioned her barely twelve-year old Maria; then, when she resisted, crying, "It is a sin! God forbids it!" he stabbed her fourteen times. As she lay dying, Maria assured the attending priest, "Yes, I forgive Alessandro! I want him to be in Paradise with me someday." Imprisoned, unrepentant, Alessandro changed after dreaming that a radiant Maria had offered him fourteen lilies. "I've kept my promise," she smiled. "You'll be here with me someday." Upon release, he rushed to beg Assunta's forgiveness. "Jesus has forgiven you," she replied, "my Maria too. How can I refuse?" Next morning, mother and murderer walked arm to church and knelt side by side for Communion.

Prayer of Expression

The Prayer of Expression, also called "Creative Prayer," generally appeals to "feeling" types and gives you the chance to express your inner self and find God in movement and action. Instead of kneeling to pray, it usually involves some kind of physical activity. It is "praying by doing." You draw, paint, sculpt, photograph, play a musical instrument, dance, act, mime, juggle, garden, run, stretch into a yoga posture, or even practice martial art forms. You pray with your whole body: eyes, ears, muscles, joints.

The key to this form of prayer is being mindful. You consciously remember that you are in the presence of God right here, right now. By using the body and talents God has given you, you praise and express the very spirit of God.

Pro-Life Student Group Launches New Outreach for Pro-Life Medical Students

Washington, DC (LifeNews.com)-The national organization for pro-life college and university students is launching a new national outreach to medical students. Students for Life of America is launching their Medical Students for Life program designed to give support to pro-life medical students in a manner they've never experienced.

Kristan Hawkins, the director of Students for Life America, tells LifeNews.com Medical Students for Life aims to unite pro-life students at medical schools around the country at a time when many are facing pressure to learn abortions.

The program is designed to give them the resources they need to spread the pro-life message to their peers, she said.

"Never before has there been such a program to help pro-life medical students organize on their university's campus. Medical professionals are on the front lines of the pro-life movement, and it is important for us to train the next generation of pro-life physicians," Hawkins told LifeNews.com.

Students for Life of America has hired Dominique Moniezun to lead the initiative to network and training pro-life medical students as the National Coordinator for Medical Students for Life.

Dominique was accepted to Tulane School of Medicine during his sophomore year at Tulane University and is set to graduate summa cum laude in spring of 2011 with a double major in Philosophy and English.

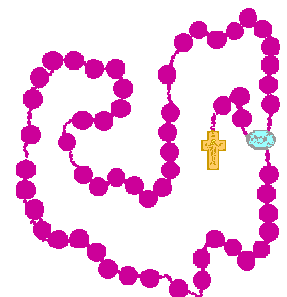
He will enter Tulane's medical class in the dual degree program of Medical Doctor and Master's in Public Health during the fall of 2011.

Dominique believes the greatest impact he can make in the pro-life movement is by joining the medical profession and looks forward to supporting his pro-life peers in medical schools across the country.

"We as members of society expect our medical professionals to be safeguards of life," says Moniezun. "I am passionately committed to helping other young adults study medicine and cultivate the original Hippocratic Oath's pledge to respect the dignity of every human life, including the unborn."

Medical Students for Life has already begun preparing for the fall school year and invites pro-life medical students to learn more about its new programs.

Nuestra Iglesia, que cuenta con más de dos mil años, todavía necesita a hombres llenos de idealismo y entusiasmo deseosos de responder al llamado a ser sacerdotes. En este día rezamos por vocaciones al sacerdocio; como el Señor dice a sus discípulos: "Rueguen, por tanto, al dueño de la mies que envíe trabajadores a sus campos" (Lucas 10:2).

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SANTA MARÍA GORETTI (1890-1902) 6 de julio

María Goretti nació en Italia, cerca de Roma, en una familia campesina muy pobre y debido a ello se vieron obligados a vivir en un rancho y compartir la casa con la familia Serenelli. Dos años después sufrió la muerte de su padre, situación que obligó a la madre a asumir las labores del campo para mantener a la familia y, a María, la forzó a renunciar a la escuela para hacerse cargo del hogar y del cuidado de sus hermanitos; aun así, se daba tiempo para asistir al catecismo. A los 12 años María era una mujer bella y bien formada, fue precisamente esto lo que atrajo a Alejandro Serenelli, de 18 años, a proponerle que tuvieran relaciones sexuales, pero María se negó una y otra vez porque eso iba contra la voluntad de Dios. Cierta día llegó Alejandro a casa y al saber que María estaba sola quiso forzarla, pero María se opuso y, lleno de rabia, la apuñaló 14 veces. María murió al día siguiente, perdonándolo. Fue canonizada en 1950, estando presente su madre y sus hermanos.

Enviados en Misión

Este mes, el evangelio de san Lucas nos dice que Jesús envió a 72 hombres, de dos en dos, para predicar la Palabra de Dios y curar a los enfermos. Fueron enviados solamente con lo que traían puesto, advertidos de no llevar nada más con ellos más que su fe en Jesús de que Dios les proveería. Antes que Jesús regresara al Padre otra vez envió a sus discípulos en misión: "Vayan, entonces, y hagan que todos los pueblos sean mis discípulos, bautizándolos en el nombre del Padre y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo, y enseñándoles a cumplir todo lo que yo les he mandado. Y yo estoy con ustedes hasta el fin mundo".

Para el beato Junipero Serra, cuyo día de celebración es el 1 de Julio, este llamado de Jesús de evangelizar se convirtió en el centro de su vida. Este santo caminó miles de kilómetros desde México hasta California, estableciendo misiones, enfrentando peligros y amenaza, soportando el mal tiempo y hambre, y confiado—como los 72 hombres enviados por Jesús a predicar la Palabra de Dios—en el poder del Evangelio que predicaba. Se dice que el padre Junipero bautizó a más de 6,000 personas y confirmó a más de 5,000

Así como los 72 hombres, los discípulos y el beato Junipero, todos somos llamados a evangelizar y a hacer discípulos a toda la gente. Este llamado no es solo para los obispos y sacerdotes, o para los religiosos o religiosas y misioneros. Por medio de nuestro bautismo cada uno de nosotros somos llamados y enviados en misión para traer a Cristo y el reino de Dios a todos.
